A COMMUNITY UPDATE

October 2020

North Sydney Catholic Education Precinct will unite Parish and community around innovative education and Catholic values.

The reinvigorated education precinct will support students from early learning to year 12, to new and exciting pathways beyond school. The precinct will bring together Our Lady of the Way Parish with St Mary's Church at the centre, and join together St Mary's Catholic Primary School and Marist College North Shore as one K-12 co-educational school – Marist Catholic College North Shore, from 2021.

A RECAP OF WHAT IS PROPOSED

An education precinct comprising of a high school campus, primary school campus and early learning centre.

Since the last update in June, the project team has refined the design to reduce the scale and bulk of the buildings.

- 1 Restoration of the presbytery and a new landscaped piazza outside St Mary's Church.
- 2 Removal of existing buildings along Miller and Carlow Street, including the existing childcare centre and two terrace houses.
- 3 Construction of a new building with four levels above a basement carpark with rooftop play space located on the corner of Miller and Carlow Street. This will support the flexible learning of the new K-12 school.
- 4 A new four storey building with a rooftop along Miller Street that will include contemporary learning facilities, a multi-purpose auditorium and an early learning centre.
- 5 A new basement car park and underground drop-off and pick-up zone.
- 6 Student capacity will be increased incrementally from 1,200 students we have today, up to 2000 students by 2030. This includes 90 early learning places.



The precinct is focused on excellent outcomes for students throughout their education.

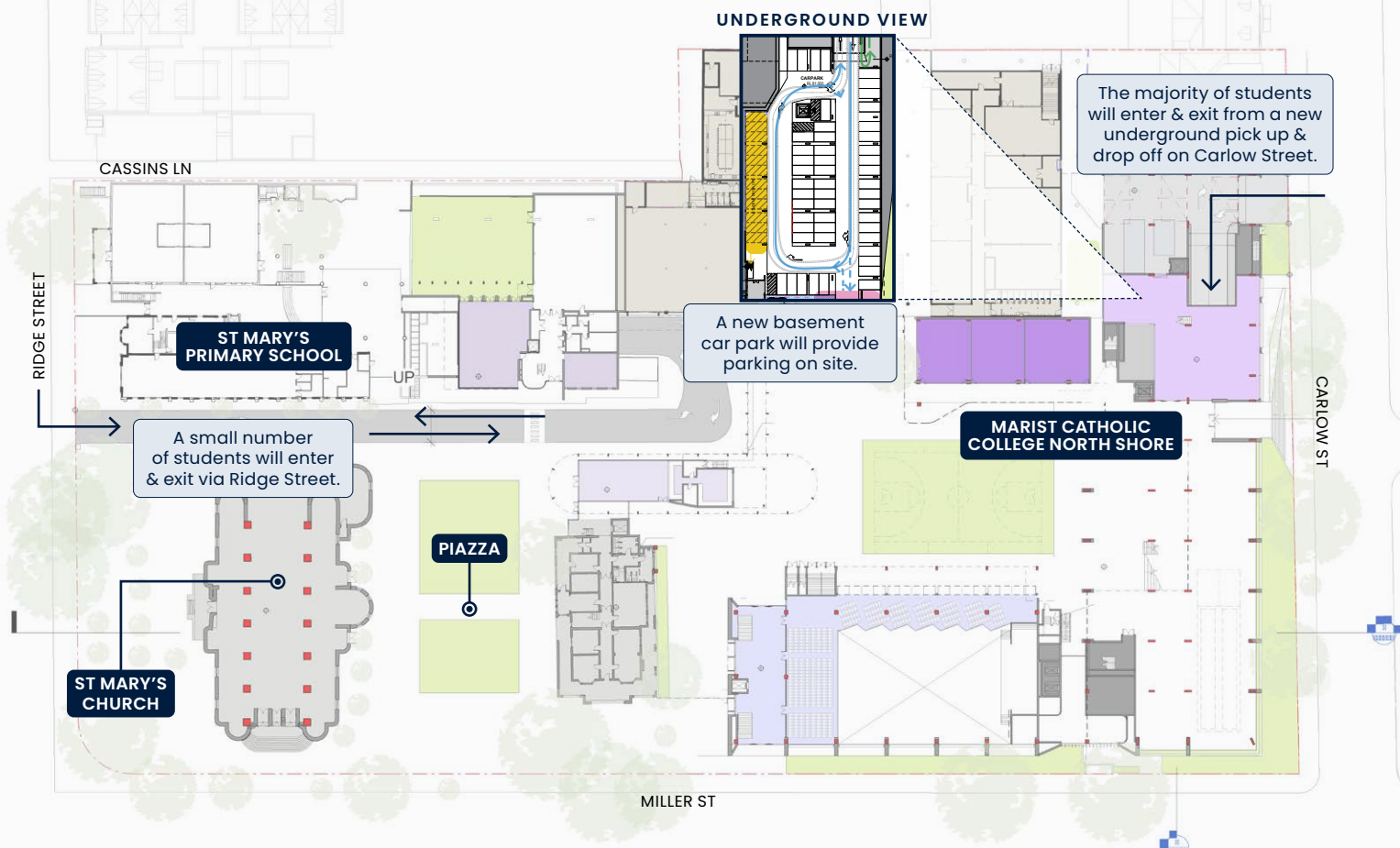

MANAGING TRAFFIC FLOW

Sydney Catholic Schools understands the importance of managing school drop-off and pick-up to minimise impacts on near neighbours.

As well as implementing traffic solutions to manage traffic flow, Sydney Catholic Schools will also be launching a Green Travel Plan to promote the use of public transport, walking and cycling by students, visitors and staff.

The masterplan will include two designated drop-off zones for the school community. This includes the existing pick up and drop off on Ridge Street and a new underground pick up and drop off on Carlow Street.

NEXT STEPS

- **June 2020:** community update 1
- **October 2020:** community update 2 and community engagement webinars (we are here)
- **Late 2020:** State Significant Development Application (SSDA) is lodged with Department of Planning, Industry and Environment (DPIE).
- **Late 2020–early 2021:** SSDA on public exhibition for community feedback.
- **2021:** Existing facilities refurbished to support the introduction of co-education at Marist Catholic College North Shore.
- **2021:** A determination of the SSDA is anticipated.

Pending approval, the precinct will be delivered in a series of stages, carefully planned to minimise impacts on students and neighbours.
